# **ACTION ITEMS**

## Action Item 3a:

#### **DE Committee Core Value Statement:**

The core value of the DE Committee is to increase educational access for students by supporting online delivery of high quality instruction. All students should have the opportunity to achieve their educational goals regardless of their geographic location, situational disadvantage, or socioeconomic status.

Rationale: Core values reflect what the committee values. They are the essence of the committee's identity – the principles, beliefs or philosophy of values. Establishing core values help support the decision-making processes.

The core value statement would be added to the DE Committee Webpage, after the Purpose Statement:

### **Purpose**

The purpose of the Distance Education Committee will be to advise the Senate, its Curriculum subcommittee, and the Technology Planning Committee on designs, implementation strategies, resources needed, and policies for distance education; to provide a faculty overview of all distance education and distributed activities conducted at Imperial Valley College; and to work with all relevant faculty and administrators to foster innovation while maintaining, enhancing, and evaluating high standards of academic quality, at a level appropriate to the students for which the content is developed.

#### **Function**

The function of the Distance Education Committee is to develop and review policies and procedures necessary to the implementation and evaluation of the distance education program at Imperial Valley College.

## Action Item 3b:

#### AP 4105 Distance Education

Reference:

Title 5, Sections 55200 et seq.

U.S. Department of Education regulations on the Integrity of Federal Student Financial Aid Programs under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended; 34 C.F.R. § 602.17.

Consistent with federal regulations pertaining to federal financial aid eligibility, the District must authenticate or verify that the student who registers in a distance education or correspondence education courses is the same student who participates in and completes the course or program and receives the academic credit. The District will provide to each student at the time of registration, a statement of the process in place to protect student privacy and estimated additional student charges associated with verification of student identity, if any.

The Chief Instructional Officer shall utilize one or more of these methods to authenticate or verify the student's identity:

- secure credentialing/login and password;
- proctored examinations; or
- new or other technologies and practices that are effective in verifying student identification.

<u>Definition</u>: Distance education means instruction in which the instructor and student are separated by distance and interact through the assistance of communication technology. This definition includes both hybrid and fully online courses.

<u>Course Approval</u>: Each proposed or existing course offered by distance education shall be reviewed and approved separately. Separate approval is mandatory if any portion of the instruction in a course or a course section is designed to be provided through distance education.

The review and approval of new and existing distance education courses shall follow the curriculum approval procedures outlined in Administrative Procedures 4020, Program and Curriculum Development. Distance education courses shall be approved under the same conditions and criteria as all other courses.

Certification: When approving distance education courses, the Curriculum Committee will certify the following:

- <u>Course Quality Standards</u>: The same standards of course quality are applied to the distance education courses as are applied to traditional classroom courses, as expressed in the course outline of record.
- <u>Course Quality Determinations</u>: Determinations and judgments about the quality of the distance education course were made with the full involvement of the Curriculum & Instruction Committee approval procedures.

<u>Instructor Contact</u>: Each section of the course that is delivered through distance education will include regular, effective contact between instructor and students.

<u>Duration of Approval</u>: All distance education courses approved under this procedure will continue to be in effect unless there are substantive changes of the course outline.

<u>Use of Blackboard for Distance Education</u>: All distance education courses must utilize the <u>Blackboard</u> course management system unless prior approval for alternative technologies is given by the faculty member's division chair, in consultation with the Chief Instruction Officer and the Distance Education Coordinator.

The following steps will be followed when developing and delivering online courses at Imperial Valley College:

- 1. Obtain approval to develop an online or hybrid class from dean, division chair, and/or department chair.
- 2. Complete two sessions of customized @ONE training (Introduction to Online Teaching and Learning; Introduction to Teaching with Blackboard).
- 3. Develop at least 50% of course for review and approval through Distance Education Committee (see the Distance Education Course Review form).
- 4. If necessary, complete an online addendum in CurricUNET for approval through the Curriculum Committee.
- 5. Receive approval from DSP&S specialist that course content is Section 508 compliant.
- 6. Online faculty are responsible for taking four (4) additional @ONE courses within three years after completing the introductory training (Course Management: Blackboard; Building Online Community with Social Media; Creating Accessible Online Courses; Designing Effective Online Assessment).

Rationale: The online course development process should be set forth in the Online Teaching Handbook, rather than in an Administrative Procedure. This provides more flexibility in making adjustments to the procedure, when necessary.

## Course Development Process

- 1. Obtain approval to develop an online or hybrid class from dean, division chair, and/or department chair.
- Complete one (1) session two (2) sessions of customized @ONE training (Introduction to Online Teaching and Learning and Introduction to Teaching with Blackboard). Online faculty are responsible for taking four (4) three (3) more @ONE courses within three years after completing the introductory training (Course Management: Blackboard; Building Online Community with Social Media; Creating Accessible Online Courses; Designing Effective Online Assessments)
- 3. Develop at least 50% of course for review and approval through the Distance Education Committee.
- 4. Complete an online addendum in CurricUNET for approval through the Curriculum Committee, if needed.
- 5. Receive approval from DSP&S specialist that course content is Section 508 compliant.
