CAMPUS UPDATES

Greetings Campus Community:

I hope everyone is doing well. I wanted to share a brief update on a few important items as we wrap up the year and prepare for the new year.

Federal Update: Democratic attorneys general from 20 states and the District of Columbia, along with several school districts, are challenging the U.S. Department of Education's decision to transfer certain functions to other federal agencies through seven interagency agreements. At the same time, Congress has yet to pass nine remaining appropriations bills, including the major LHHS bill, raising concerns about limited progress before the upcoming recess. Lawmakers face a January 30, 2026, deadline to approve funding and prevent another shutdown. We continue to work closely with the Community College League of California and our SDICCCA partners to monitor these developments and advocate for stable funding, student affordability, and support for innovative programs.

Enrollment Update: Outstanding job, everyone, for closing the enrollment gap. Our Winter intersession numbers continue to shine. We are currently 7% over last year, with 720.01 FTES compared to 670.61 FTES. Woohoo! For Spring, we are still a little behind, pacing about 8% under last year with 2164.17 FTES compared to 2347.45 FTES. But I know our dynamic team will close that gap, just as you always do. Thank you for your continued hard work, creativity, and commitment to our students. Great job, everyone!

Participatory Governance and Brown Act Committees: As a reminder, our collective bargaining agreement requires all faculty to participate in a committee. After reviewing the current roster, it appears several individuals are not yet accounted for. Many of you may remember that ACCJC previously issued a warning on this matter, which is why committee participation was added to the contract.

If you are not currently assigned to a committee, please join one. Your engagement and voice matter, and this is one of the strongest ways to contribute to our shared work.

Additionally, AP 2325: Teleconference Meeting will be updated during the Winter Session to comply with revisions to the Government Code regarding "just cause" or "emergency circumstances" for meeting attendance.

Vice President of Instruction Update: After an extensive five-month search, we have identified our next Vice President of Instruction, Dr. Jules Johnson, who will begin on January 1 pending board approval. The applicant pool for this position was exceptionally strong. After a comprehensive review process, including committee interviews, campus forums, and the President's Cabinet evaluation, Dr. Jules was selected based on their experience, qualifications, and demonstrated ability to fulfill the responsibilities of the role.

We look forward to welcoming Dr. Jules and engaging in a comprehensive onboarding process to fully align our work with Vision 2030 goals.

Please note that during the first two weeks of Dr. Jules' employment, they will be participating in a full orientation and will not be fully available for day-to-day meetings, approvals, or operational matters. It is important that they are onboarded properly and gain a strong understanding of IVC's processes, culture, and expectations before making critical decisions.

During this initial orientation period, Vice President Villa will continue serving as the essential point of contact for all daily inquiries and approvals. After this period, she will continue to retain routing authority for documents — including TDX, NeoEd, Adobe, leave requests, and others — in consultation with Dr. Jules through February 12, the start of the spring semester, to ensure smooth and uninterrupted operations.

Also, please note to minimize confusing between us two, they will go by Dr. J.J. or Dr. Jules.

Faculty Prioritization Process: This year's faculty prioritization process was thoughtful, collaborative, and deeply student-centered. I want to thank the Instructional Council and the Academic Senate for your careful review, analysis, and recommendations. Your leadership throughout this process is greatly appreciated.

Although we made a few necessary adjustments, we made every effort to maintain the same order and priorities recommended by both groups. The rationale for those adjustments has been shared with the Academic Leadership.

- Biology for Transfer
- Chemistry
- Computer Information Technology
- Emergency Medical Services
- Biology for Transfer

Also, we plan to hire a few interim faculty positions, particularly Chicano studies and Music, as requested by the Senate.

Thank you again to the Instructional Council and the Academic Senate for your thoughtful work and for helping us align our hiring priorities with enrollment needs, transfer pathways, and our long-term Vision 2030 commitments.

Vision 2030 Regional Workshop: Several campus leaders attended the regional Vision 2030 workshop in San Diego on December 4 and 5 to strengthen our workforce development strategies. The workshop covered key topics including partnerships, apprenticeships, adult engagement and enrollment, and dual enrollment expansion.

A sincere thank you to Deans Houser, Silva, Torres, and Barron, Dr. Carrillo, Dr. Carr, Professors Epps and Sun, Vice President Villa and some of our regional community partners (IVEDC, SDICCCA) for representing IVC with excellence and commitment.

Campus Safety Update: Thank you to our Campus Safety Office for hosting another Active Assailant Training on Wednesday, December 3, as well as for the valuable session held in November. These trainings continue to strengthen our preparedness efforts and support a safer campus environment for students, employees, and visitors. We also look forward to next year's Campus Safety Update presentation, which will be shared during the February Board of Trustees meeting and the Academic Senate Spring meeting. These updates will provide an overview of ongoing initiatives, recent improvements, and future strategies to enhance campus safety districtwide.
