Reported Unsatisfactory: 19

At least six of those with an unsatisfactory mark were actually projects not completed. The students in those cases failed to demonstrate knowledge of plagiarism due to non-submission. (Some faculty included that information. Some did not. It may be the case that all, or most, unsatisfactory marks were the result of students failing to complete the specified assignment by end of term.)

In some classes, the plagiarism measure was taken near the end of term when overall numbers were reduced.
