Changes to One-Unit Classes

Justification: to replace a complex array of one-unit classes with laboratory classes due to difficulty with staffing one-unit classes and providing quality instruction across all levels; to improve student access to reading classes at levels 3, 4 and 5.

Background: In the Fall of 2011, the ESL Department is offering 15 units of one-unit classes recommended for students at levels 1 and 2 and five (5) units of lab classes:

This semester the ESL Department is offering 32 sections of one-unit courses. Only nine sections are taught by full-time ESL instructors. We are offering 10 one-unit classes on the main campus, 12 at WMJH, and 10 at SDSU.

Reading classes: by eliminating one-unit classes at level 3, 4 and 5, the ESL Department will be able to offer at least one or two additional sections of ESL 023, 024, and 025, thus meeting the demand.

ESL 041 and 042: Considering the popularity and nature of conversation classes-ESL 041 and ESL 042- should we continue offering them in addition to lab classes?

ESL 010: increase from 1 to 2 units to include grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation components. Considering that we have 5 sections of ESL 001 and six sections of ESL 002, we need to offer at least 10 lab sections: 6 on the main campus and 4 at SDSU.

Do we want to offer lab classes for levels 3, 4 and 5?

No changes to the schedule: 8:00-10:30 and 12:15-2:45 (main campus) to accommodate students taking ESL 041 and ESL 042.
